WINDOW TREATMENTS

■ Canvas Natural Roman shades from Smith + Noble Lenny Kravitz's designer, Benjamin Norjega-Ortiz, favors these shades because "they're well made and look more expensive than they are." Each blind is cut to fit your window, so be sure to get your measurements correct. For an inside mount (where the shade is contained within the window frame), measure across the top, center and bottom of the frame; use the narrowest measurement. Calculate the height by measuring from the left, center and



right, and take the longest dimension. For an outside mount (in which the shade is attached to the wall or molding), add one and a half inches to each side. Then get the height by adding two inches at the top and one and a half inches at the bottom. Canvas shades, \$104–\$715; 800-765-7776 or smithandnoble.com.
